She prepared for her Jubilees by meeting weekly with a sister Jubilarian to discuss ways to know God better or to talk about a book she had been reading. Reading was a favorite pastime for Sister. Her room was full of books. She enjoyed sharing about them, which made for good conversation at table.

Artistic and musical talents came naturally to Sister Mary Loretto. She had a beautiful soprano voice and was accomplished also in art. During her later years in the infirmary, she participated in the many activities provided, especially enjoying the painting classes and musical programs.

Sister Mary Loretto loved to be with people and to relate stories about the past. She developed strong relationships with lay staff, and several friends were very faithful in visiting with Sister, even watching at her bedside during her final days.

A special joy for Sister was the celebration of her 70<sup>th</sup> Jubilee in 2013. She delighted in "dressing up" for the occasion and prepared herself spiritually for the event.
