Sister Mary Tina Petrick, from the Toledo Province, truly has a missionary heart. After her time of service was ended in PNG in October, 2013, Sister gladly volunteered to assist in the Uganda mission. Being driven through the very overcrowded streets of Kampala on a motorcycle is not for the faint hearted! A highlight for Sister Mary Tina was meeting a neighbor who lived through the bitter years when the dictator, Idi Amin, was in power. She wrote a book about her incredible

experiences. Sister Mary Tina is now reading her book.
