She enjoyed her ministry at the library assisting students locate just the right reference materials. Sister Susan Marie was most gentle and kind, always very concerned about others' welfare. She enjoyed the simple pleasures of life. One of those pleasures was swimming. She also liked cooking and with practice came up with some appetizing meals including attractive, delicious desserts.

A favorite saying of hers was, "Jesus, you love me so much!" In 2022 with her health declining, it became necessary for Sister to take up residence in a skilled care center. There she never lost her smile or concern for others. She loved visiting residents and spending time with them. The Jesus whom she loved so much came on the morning of May 30.
