SND USA employees decided that they will embrace goals that reflect a partnership with the sisters to engage in sustainable lifestyle practices. As a result, each department developed a goal that is responsive to the chapter's goal of Adoption of Sustainable Lifestyles.

Facilities

- Focusing on the best use of the many buildings across the province, investing in a smaller fleet of hybrid cars.
- Toledo is recycling all they can and has installed motion sensors and updated lighting with more efficient fixtures.
- Housekeeping in Chardon is using recipes for cleaning solutions made from natural ingredients.
- Employees are reusing or repurposing materials. Their mantra: Repair when possible rather than buy new.
- In Chardon the team continues to be selective in how much of the grass is mowed.

Finance

- Toledo is emailing over printing. They have digitalized old records.
- In Chardon dual monitors are used to prevent the need to print. Documents are saved electronically.
- Employees in Covington are walking to work, using direct deposit, have gone paperless with utility bills, and are recycling plastic bags.
- In Thousand Oaks the finance team has decreased printing and is emailing over printing.

Food Service

- Food Service in Chardon is engaging in many practices such as,
- Electronic invoices
- Avoid using single-use plastic containers where possible
- Disposable containers are being replaced by compostables
- Using recycled equipment
- Orders for daily meals for the sisters are taken electronically

Health Care

- Healthcare in Chardon moved to electronic communications to avoid paper waste.
- In Toledo, sound and acceptable ways to deal with medical waste is a priority.
- Thousand Oaks is using electronic Health Record which improves accessibility and collaboration with health care practitioners.

Human Resources

• By doing as much as possible electronically, HR is reducing paper usage.

Information Technology (IT)

• The IT department is helping employees and sisters to have one computer and moving files to the cloud which use less energy.

- SND USA Magazine is produced twice a year over three times per year.
- In Toledo, the team avoids using disposable items whenever possible for their events.
- Thousand Oaks is committed to composting and reducing water and electricity usage.
